REGULATION OF THE INDONESIAN COAST GUARD NUMBER 12 OF 2021

ON

PREVENTION AND ERADICATION OF ABUSE AND ILLICIT TRAFFICKING OF NARCOTICS, PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES AND OTHER ADDICTIVE SUBSTANCES IN THE INDONESIAN COAST GUARD

BY THE BLESSINGS OF ALMIGHTY GOD

THE CHIEF OF INDONESIAN COAST GUARD

- Considering: a. to carry out prevention and eradication of abuse and illicit trafficking, narcotics, psychotropic substances and other addictive substances in the Indonesian Coast Guard, it is is necessary to regulate measures to control narcotics, psychotropic substances and addictive substances in an effective, efficient and comprehensive manner.
 - b. based on the consideration as referred to in point a, it is necessary to issue a Regulation of the Indonesian Coast Guard on Prevention and Eradication of Abuse and Illicit Trafficking in Narcotics, Psychotropic Substances and Other Addictive Substances in the Indonesian Coast Guard.
- Observing:
- Law Number 32 of 2014 on Marine Affairs (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2014 Number 294 Supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5603);
- Presidential Regulation Number 178 of 2014 on the Indonesian Coast Guard (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2014 Number 380);

HAS DECIDED:

To issue:

REGULATION OF THE INDONESIAN COAST GUARD ON PREVENTION AND ERADICATION OF ABUSE AND ILLICIT TRAFFICKING OF NARCOTICS, PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES AND OTHER ADDICTIVE SUBSTANCES IN THE INDONESIAN COAST GUARD.

Article 1

In this Regulation:

- Prevention and Eradication of Abuse and Illicit Trafficking in Narcotics. Psychotropic Substances and other Addictive Substances (Pencegahan dan Pemberantasan Penyalahgunaan dan Peredaran Gelap Narkotika. Psikotropika dan Bahan Adiktif lainnya), hereinafter as P4GN, mean efforts to prevent, eradicate, abbreviated treat and rehabilitate the abuse of narcotics, psychotropic substances and other addictive substances.
- 2. Narcotics mean substances or drugs originating from plants or non-plants, whether synthetic or semi-synthetic which can cause a decrease or change in consciousness, loss of taste, reduce or eliminate pain and can cause dependence, which are differentiated into groups as referred to in Law Number 35 of 2009 on Narcotics.
- 3. Psychotropic Substances mean substances or drugs, both natural and synthetic, not narcotics, which have psychoactive properties, through selective influence on the central nervous system which causes characteristic changes in mental activity and behavior.
- 4. Other Addictive Substances mean addictive substances except tobacco and alcohol that are substances not included in the Narcotic or Psychotropic class, but cause addiction.
- 5. Drugs mean Narcotics, Psychotropic Substances and Other Addictive Substances.
- 6. Drug Abuse, hereinafter referred to as Abuse means the use of dangerous drugs or substances for purposes other than treatment and research as well as is used without following the correct rules and dosage without the right or against the law.

- 7. Illicit Trafficking of Drugs means any activity or series of activities carried out without the right or against the law which is determined as a criminal offense of Narcotics.
- 8. Indonesian Coast Guard hereinafter referred to as Bakamla RI means a non-ministerial government institution that has the task of conducting security and safety patrols in Indonesian waters and Indonesian jurisdictional areas and is domiciled under and directly responsible to the President through the minister who coordinates it.
- 9. Bakamla RI Personnel mean permanent employees and assisting employees in Bakamla RI.
- 10. Medical Rehabilitation means a process of integrated treatment activities to free addicts from narcotics dependence.
- 11. Social Rehabilitation means a process of activities in an integrated recovery which is physical, mental or social, so that former Narcotics addicts can return to carry out social functions in community life.
- 12. Counseling means a relationship between a counselor and a drug abuser in order to help increase awareness of the problems he/she is experiencing and his/her strengths which can be used to improve his/her behavioral changes, overcome difficulties and make decisions.
- 13. Screening Test means a test or diagnosis method to find out if a person has a certain disease or condition before it causes any symptoms.

P4GN in Bakamla RI is implemented through:

- a. planning;
- b. organizing;
- c. recording and reporting; and
- d. supervision and guidance.

- (1) P4GN is carried out through a plan stipulated by the Principal Secretary of Bakamla RI.
- (2) P4GN planning as referred to in section (1) is set forth in the P4GN planning documents.
- (3) The preparation of P4GN planning documents as referred to in section (2) is carried out through coordination between the Planning and Organization Bureau, and the Bureau for General Affairs.
- (4) P4GN planning documents as referred to in section (2) at least contain:
 - a. aims and objectives;
 - b. form and mechanism of activities;
 - c. implementation of activities;
 - d. reporting; and
 - e. monitoring and evaluation.
- (5) The P4GN planning documents as referred to in section (2) are valid for a period of one budget year.

Article 4

The implementation of P4GN as referred to in Article 2 point b is carried out based on the P4GN planning documents through activities of:

- a. prevention;
- b. eradication; and
- c. rehabilitation.

Article 5

- (1) Prevention activities as referred to in Article 4 point a include:
 - a. counseling and training on P4GN to Bakamla RI personnel and their families;
 - examination through Narcotics selection test to prevent
 Drug use in Bakamla RI Personnel;
 - c. implementation of continuous raids on Bakamla RI
 Personnel and places suspected of being prone to abuse
 by Bakamla RI;

- d. dissemination of regulations related to Bakamla RI for P4GN;
- e. participating and supporting the actions of related ministries/institutions;
- f. mandatory Drug screening test for Bakamla RI personnel;
- g. training for volunteers and activists of P4GN anti-Drugs
 /for Bakamla RI personnel; and
- h. implementation of a clean village program from Drugs in coastal villages.
- (2) In the context of implementing prevention activities as referred to in section (1), Bakamla RI P4GN task force team is formed.
- (3) The Bakamla RI P4GN task force as referred to in section (2) is stipulated by a Decision of the Chief of Bakamla RI.

Eradication activities as referred to in Article 4 point b include:

- a. strict enforcement efforts against Bakamla RI Personnel who are involved in the Drug abuse and illicit trafficking in accordance with the provisions of legislation; and
- efforts to increase cooperation for the implementation of P4GN between Bakamla RI and the National Narcotics Agency, as well as other related agencies.

Article 7

- (1) Rehabilitation activities as referred to in Article 4 point c include:
 - a. medical rehabilitation; and
 - b. social rehabilitation.
- (2) Medical rehabilitation as referred to in section (1) point a is conducted at facilities of the Bakamla RI including:
 - a. treatment; and
 - b. counseling.
- (3) Social rehabilitation as referred to in section (1) point b is conducted through cooperation between the Bakamla RI and BNN (the National Narcotics Agency).

- (1) The implementation of P4GN activities as referred to in Articles 5 to Article 7 is carried out under the responsibility of:
 - a. the Principal Secretary of the Bakamla RI for the implementation of P4GN activities at the Headquarters of the Bakamla RI; and
 - the Head of the Coast Guard Maritime Zone for the implementation of P4GN activities at the Coast Guard Maritime Zone of the Bakamla RI.
- (2) The responsibility for the implementation of P4GN activities in the working area of the Coast Guard Maritime Zone as referred to in section (1) point b includes:
 - a. Maritime Security Fleet Base;
 - b. Maritime Security and Safety Monitoring Station;
 - c. Ground Station; and
 - d. State Vessels.
- (3) The implementation of P4GN activities as referred to in section (1) involves relevant work units.
- (4) In the implementation of P4GN as referred to in Article 4, the Bakamla RI may cooperate with Institutions or Government Institutions that have competence and authority in handling Drug abuse and trafficking.

Article 9

- (1) Regarding the implementation of P4GN activities, recording and reporting are conducted.
- (2) Recording and reporting of the implementation of P4GN activities are carried out by the P4GN Task Force.
- (3) Reports on the implementation of P4GN activities as referred to in section (2) are submitted by the P4GN Task Force to:
 - a. the Principal Secretary of the Bakamla RI through the Head of the Bureau for General Affairs, for the implementation of P4GN activities at the Headquarters of the Bakamla RI; and
 - b. the Head of the Coast Guard Maritime Zone of the Bakamla RI through the Section Head for General

Affairs, for the implementation of P4GN activities in the working area of the Coast Guard Maritime Zone.

(4) The Head of the Coast Guard Maritime Zoneof the Bakamla RI submits the report as referred to in section (2) point b to the Principal Secretary of the Bakamla RI.

Article 10

- (1) Recording and reporting as referred to in Article 9 consist of:
 - a. routine reports; and
 - b. special reports.
- (2) Routine reports as referred to in Article 10 point a are conducted per semester every year.
- (3) Special reports as referred to in Article 10 point b are conducted when cases of Drug abuse and illicit trafficking occur in the Bakamla RI.

Article 11

Supervision and guidance of the planning and implementation of P4GN activities at:

- a. the Headquarters of the Bakamla RI by the Chief of Bakamla RI; and
- b. the Coast Guard Maritime Zone by the Head of the Office.

Article 12

Personnel of the Bakamla RI involved in Drug abuse and trafficking are subjected to sanctions in accordance with the provisions of the legislation.

Article 13

The funding for the implementation of P4GN in the Bakamla RI is charged to the State Budget of the Bakamla RI.

Article 14

This regulation of this Agency comes into force on the date of its promulgation.

In order that every person may know hereof, it is ordered to promulgate this Regulation by its placement in the State Bulletin of the Republic of Indonesia.
