

REGULATION OF THE REGENCY OF EAST BELITUNG
NUMBER 15 OF 2023
ON
ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION

BY THE BLESSINGS OF ALMIGHTY GOD

REGENT OF EAST BELITUNG,

- Considering:
- a. that to achieve successful health development and sustainable development as part of early investment in human resources, it is necessary to create a healthy society free from stunting;
 - b. that Stunting as a chronic nutritional problem caused by insufficient nutritional intake over a long period in children under 5 (five) years of age, is still prevalent in the Regency of East Belitung and able to hinder efforts to improve public health and the development of human resource quality;
 - c. that to provide a direction, foundation, and legal certainty in accelerating stunting reduction in an effective, efficient, and coordinated manner, a regulation in its implementation is required;
 - d. that based on the considerations as referred to in point a, point b, and point c, it is necessary to issue a Regional Regulation on Acceleration of Stunting Reduction;

 4. Law Number 23 of 2014 on Local Governments (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2014 Number 244, Supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5587), as amended by Law Number 6 of 2023 on Enactment of Government Regulation in Lieu of

To Issue : REGIONAL REGULATION ON ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION.

CHAPTER I
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

In this Regional Regulation:

1. Region means the Regency of East Belitung.
2. Local Government means the Government of the Regency of East Belitung.
3. Regent means the Regent of the Regency of East Belitung.
4. Regional Apparatus means a supporting element of the Regent and the Regional House of Representatives in administering governmental affairs that fall under the authority of the region.
5. Village Government means the village head or also known by another name, assisted by village officials as administering elements of the village government in the Regency of East Belitung.
6. Stunting means growth and development disorders in children due to chronic malnutrition and repeated infections, characterized by their height being below the standards set by the minister administering government affairs in the field of health.
7. Specific Intervention means an activity carried out to address the direct causes of Stunting.
8. Sensitive Intervention means an activity carried out to address the indirect causes of stunting.
9. Acceleration of Stunting Reduction means all efforts that include Specific Interventions and Sensitive Interventions implemented in a convergent, holistic, integrative, and qualified manner through multi-sectoral cooperation at the central, regional, and village levels.
10. Monitoring means the activity of observing the progress of the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, identifying, and

anticipating issues that arise and/or will arise to take action as early as possible.

11. Evaluation means a series of activities that compares the targets and the achievements of the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
12. Stakeholders mean individuals, communities, academics, professional organizations, business sector, mass media, civil society organizations, higher education institutions, public figures, religious figures, and development partners, that are associated with the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
13. Nutritionist means any person who has graduated from an education in the field of nutrition in accordance with the provisions of legislation.
14. Health Professional means any person who dedicates themselves to the field of health and possesses knowledge and/or skills through education in the field of health, and who for certain types of work, requires authority to conduct health measures.
15. Fortification means the process of adding micronutrients (vitamins and minerals) to food.

CHAPTER II TARGET OF ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION

Article 2

Acceleration of Stunting Reduction is targeted to groups of:

- a. teenagers;
- b. grooms and brides;
- c. pregnant women;
- d. breastfeeding mothers; and
- e. children aged 0 (zero) to 59 (fifty-nine) months.

CHAPTER III PILLARS OF ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION

Article 3

Pillars in the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction include:

- a. enhancement of commitment and vision of leadership in the Local Government;
- b. enhancement of communication, behavioral change, and community empowerment;
- c. enhancement of the convergence of Specific Interventions and Sensitive Interventions in Local Government;
- d. enhancement of food security and nutrition at the individual, family, and community levels; and
- e. strengthening and development of systems, data, information, research, and innovation.

Article 4

The enhancement of commitment and vision of leadership as referred to in Article 3 point a, the Local Government performs:

- a. enhancement of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction commitment; and

- b. enhancement of Village Government capacities.

Article 5

- (1) The enhancement of commitment as referred to in Article 4 point a includes:
 - a. the coordination meeting at the Region level.
 - b. the discussion on Stunting at the sub-district level.
 - c. the availability of rural /urban village midwives in accordance with the needs.
 - d. the realization of Stunting-free rural/urban villages; and
 - e. the enhancement in Local budget allocation for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
- (2) The enhancement of Village Government capacities as referred to in Article 4 point b includes:
 - a. enhancing the capacity of the Village Government in addressing the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction; and
 - b. conducting coaching for human development cadres in the rural/urban villages.

Article 6

The enhancement of communication, behavioral change, and community empowerment as referred to in Article 3 point a, the Local Government performs:

- a. sustainable campaigns and communications for behavioral change;
- b. strengthening institutional capacity in communicating behavioral change for the Stunting reduction; and
- c. strengthening the role of religious organizations in communicating behavioral change for the Stunting reduction.

Article 7

- (1) Sustainable campaigns and communications for behavior change as referred to in Article 6 point a includes:
 - a. conducting stunting prevention campaigns;
 - b. conducting dissemination to families not to defecate in public places;
 - c. conducting dissemination to families to implement clean and healthy living behaviors; and
 - d. providing complete basic immunization to children under 5 (five) years of age.
- (2) Strengthening institutional capacity in communicating behavioral change for the Stunting reduction as referred to in Article 6 point b includes:
 - a. providing education and training on stimulation of handling stunting to early childhood education teachers;
 - b. establishing an early childhood education institution that develops integrated holistic early-childhood education;
 - c. establishing the service standards for monitoring growth and development at the integrated health post

- (posyandu)*;
 - d. establishing the village that implements classes of family development for Children under 5 (five) years about the first 1000 (one thousand) days of life;
 - e. establishing the group of beneficiary families of the family hope program who participate in family capacity building meetings with health and nutrition modules; and
 - f. conducting reproductive health and nutrition education for the youth by the center for adolescent counseling and information and family development.
- (3) Strengthening the role of religious organizations in communicating behavioral change for the Stunting reduction as referred to in Article 6 point c includes conducting forum on communication for behavioral change in reducing Stunting across religions.

Article 8

Enhancement of the convergence of Specific Interventions and Sensitive Interventions in Local Government as referred to in Article 3 point c, the Local Government perform:

- a. convergence in planning and budgeting, as well as the implementation of activities to improve the type, coverage, and quality of specific interventions and sensitive interventions in the Region; and
- b. convergence in the efforts to prepare for family life.

Article 9

- (1) The convergence in planning and budgeting, as well as the implementation of activities to improve the type, coverage, and quality of specific interventions and sensitive interventions in the Region as referred to in Article 8 point a includes:
- a. establishing the Region that integrates programs and activities for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction into regional planning and budgeting documents (Regional Long-Term Development Plan, Regional Medium-Term Development Plan, Regional Food and Nutrition Action Plan, Local Government Work Plan, as well as Local Budget and Regional Work and Budget Plan);
 - b. establishing rural/urban villages that integrate the programs and activities for Accelerating the Stunting Reduction within the village planning and budgeting documents (Medium-Term Village Development Plan, Village Government Work Plan, as well as Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget and Village Work and Budget Plan);
 - c. establishing rural/urban villages that increase the allocation of rural/urban village funds for Specific Interventions and Sensitive Interventions in Stunting

- reduction;
 - d. establishing rural/urban villages conducting convergence in the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction;
 - e. establishing rural/urban villages conducting community-based total sanitation;
 - f. providing the percentage of teenage girls who consume iron tablets;
 - g. increasing the percentage of brides/prospective mothers who receive iron tablets;
 - h. increasing the percentage of pregnant women with chronic energy deficiency who receive additional nutritional intake;
 - i. increasing the percentage of pregnant women who consume at least 90 (ninety) iron tablets during their pregnancy;
 - j. increasing the percentage of infants under 6 (six) months receiving exclusive breastfeeding;
 - k. increasing the percentage of children aged 6 (six) to 23 (twenty-three) months who receive complementary food in addition to breastmilk;
 - l. increasing the percentage of children under 5 (five) years of age suffering from malnutrition in order to receive malnutrition management services;
 - m. increasing the percentage of malnourished children under 5 (five) years of age who are receiving additional nutritional intake;
 - n. increasing the percentage of children under 5 (five) years of age whose growth and development are monitored; and
 - o. increasing the percentage of children under 5 (five) years of age receiving complete basic immunization.
- (2) Convergence in the efforts to prepare for family life as referred to in Article 8 point b includes:
- a. providing assistance to families at risk of Stunting;
 - b. providing reproductive health support and nutrition education for three (3) months prior to marriage to prospective couples of childbearing ages;
 - c. providing anemia status (hemoglobin) testing services for adolescent girls;
 - d. providing data from the results of surveillance of families at risk of Stunting;
 - e. providing family planning services for postpartum phases; and
 - f. reducing the percentage of unmet need for family planning services.

Article 10

Enhancement of food security and nutrition at the individual, family, and community levels as referred to in Article 3 point c, the Local Government performs:

- a. fulfillment of food and nutrition needs for individuals, families, and communities, including during disaster situations; and
- b. enhancement of food fortification quality.

Article 11

- (1) Fulfillment of food and nutrition needs for individuals, families, and communities, including during disaster situations as referred to in Article 10 point a includes:
 - a. increasing the percentage of families at risk of Stunting who benefit from the resources of home gardens for enhancing nutritional intake;
 - b. increasing the percentage of families at risk of Stunting who receive promotion for increased consumption of domestic fish;
 - c. increasing the percentage of beneficiary families with pregnant women, breastfeeding mothers, and children under two years of age who receive a variety of food assistance besides rice and eggs (carbohydrates, animal protein, plant protein, vitamins and minerals, and/or complementary food in addition to breastmilk);
 - d. increasing the coverage of couples of childbearing ages who are classified as poor and those facing social welfare issues that receive conditional cash assistance;
 - e. increasing the coverage of fertile age couples who are poor and social welfare problem cases receiving non-cash food assistance; and
 - f. increasing the coverage of poor and underprivileged couples of childbearing ages who become recipients of health insurance contribution assistance.
- (2) Enhancement of food fortification quality as referred to in Article 10 point a includes increasing the percentage of surveillance on fortified food products that are followed up by business actors.

Article 12

The strengthening and development of systems, data, information, research, and innovation as referred to in Article 3 point d, the Local Government performs:

- a. the strengthening of the integrated Monitoring and Evaluation system for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction;
- b. the development of an integrated data and information system;
- c. strengthening research and innovation as well as development and utilization of research and innovation results; and
- d. the development of knowledge management systems.

Article 13

- (1) The strengthening of the integrated Monitoring and Evaluation system for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction as referred to in Article 12 point a includes:
 - a. conducting Monitoring and Evaluation of the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction in the Region; and
 - b. conducting an audit of stunting cases targeting individuals at risk of stunting, includes:
 1. teenagers;
 2. grooms and brides;
 3. pregnant women;
 4. breastfeeding mothers; and
 5. children aged 0 (zero)-59 (fifty-nine) months.
- (2) The development of an integrated data and information system as referred to in Article 12 point b includes providing updated family data on Stunting risk through the family information system.

CHAPTER IV IMPLEMENTATION OF ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION

Article 14

- (1) Local Government organizes the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction by referring to the national strategy for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
- (2) In order to implement the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1), the Local Government perform programs and activities for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
- (3) In order to implement the program and activities for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (2), the Local Government conducts:
 - a. strengthening planning and budgeting;
 - b. improvement of the quality of implementation;
 - c. improvement of the quality of Monitoring, Evaluation, and reporting; and
 - d. enhancement of human resource capacity.

Article 15

- (1) In order to organize the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, the Local Government may involve ministries/agencies, provincial Government, regency/municipal Governments, relevant Village Governments, and Stakeholders.
- (2) The involvement as referred to in section (1) is conducted in a convergent and integrated manner.

CHAPTER V COORDINATION OF ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION

Article 16

- (1) In order to conduct the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction at the regional level, the Regent establishes a regency Stunting Reduction Acceleration team.

- (2) The regency Stunting Reduction Acceleration team is tasked to coordinate, synergize, and evaluate the implementation of the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction at the regency and sub-district levels.
- (3) The regency Stunting Reduction Acceleration team as referred to in section (2) consists of Regional Apparatuses and Stakeholders, including the family welfare empowerment mobilization team.
- (4) The composition of the membership of regency Stunting Reduction Acceleration team is adjusted to the needs of the Local Government.
- (5) The Regency Stunting Reduction Acceleration team as referred to in section (2) is tasked to:
 - a. review and analyze the issues of stunting and nutritional improvement;
 - b. conduct a cross-sector role mapping related to the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction;
 - c. implement and allocate the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction program in the form of sustainable activities;
 - d. monitor and evaluate the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction program;
 - e. conduct dissemination to sub-district and village level in relation to the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction program; and
 - f. submit reports to the Regent on a regular basis.
- (6) The Stunting Reduction Acceleration team as referred to in section (1) is determined by a Regent Decision.

CHAPTER VI DETERMINATION OF TARGET AREAS FOR ACCELERATING STUNTING REDUCTION

Article 17

- (1) In attempt to the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, the target intervention areas are designated.
- (2) The designation of target areas for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction as referred in section (1) is based on considerations that include:
 - a. the high incidence of Stunting;
 - b. the necessity of resource efficiency;
 - c. the implementation and effectiveness of the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction that are more focused;
 - d. the measurement of target achievements that are more controlled; and
 - e. being able to serve as a basis for expansion.
- (3) Establishment of target areas for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction as referred to in section (1) and section (2) is coordinated by the Regional Apparatus responsible for planning.

CHAPTER VII
RURAL/URBAN VILLAGES GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION

Article 18

- (1) Village Government coordinate and conduct village-level Acceleration of Stunting Reduction at village level.
- (2) Village Government prioritize the use of village fund in supporting the implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
- (3) Village Government optimize the program and activity for village development in supporting the implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.

Article 19

- (1) Village Government plays an active role in attempt of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction through:
 - a. mobilizing the community in efforts of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction;
 - b. planning activities that support efforts of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction; and
 - c. allocating budget to implement efforts of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
- (2) In order to implement the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction at the rural/urban village level, the rural/urban village head establishes Stunting Reduction Acceleration team at the rural/urban village level.
- (3) Rural/urban village of Stunting Reduction Acceleration team is tasked to coordinate, synergize, and evaluate the implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction at the rural/urban village level.
- (4) Rural/urban villages level Acceleration of Stunting Reduction team involves:
 - a. Health Professionals at least midwives, Nutritionists, and Environmental Health Professionals;
 - b. family planning counselors and/or family planning field officers;
 - c. driving team of family welfare empowerment; and
 - d. village family planning assistant and/or village family planning sub-assistant or human development cadres, agents, and/or other community elements.
- (5) The composition of the membership of rural/urban village Stunting Reduction Acceleration team is adjusted to the needs of the rural/urban Village Government.

Article 20

Regency/municipal Governments provide considerations, suggestions, and recommendations to Village Governments in the planning and budgeting of village development programs and activities related to Acceleration of Stunting Reduction in accordance with the provisions of legislation.

CHAPTER VIII COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

Article 21

- (1) The community participates in the activities of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.
- (2) The community can provide input and/or solutions to the issue of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction in order to make it more effective and efficient.

CHAPTER IX MONITORING, EVALUATION AND REPORTING

Article 22

Monitoring, Evaluation, and reporting are intended to:

- a. monitor the progress and success of the implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction;
- b. provide feedback for the progress of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction implementation;
- c. serve as a consideration on Acceleration of Stunting Reduction planning and budgeting as well as enhancement of accountability;
- d. provide an assessment of the suitability of activities, outputs, and regional strategy targets in Acceleration of Stunting Reduction and the action plan; and
- e. serve as a consideration for providing recommendations aimed at achieving the successful implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction.

Article 23

- (1) The Local Government conducts Monitoring and Evaluation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction implementation in accordance with its authority.
- (2) The Monitoring and Evaluation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction implementation as referred to in section (1) supported by:
 - a. integrated data management system at the national, regional, and village levels by maximizing existing information systems through the one data Indonesia mechanism in accordance with the provisions of legislation; and
 - b. research and innovation as well as the development of the utilization of research and innovation results.

Article 24

Regent submits a report on the implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction to the governor twice a year or at any time when necessary.

Article 25

The provisions regarding guidelines for the planning, implementation, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction are regulated by a Regent Regulation.

CHAPTER X AWARD

Article 26

- (1) Local Governments may grant awards to communities and/or institutions that are concerned with the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction in Region.
- (2) The award as referred to in section (1) is granted during national holidays and/or health-related observances.

CHAPTER XI FUNDING

Article 27

Funding for the implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction is sourced from:

- a. State Budget;
- b. Local Budget; and/or
- c. other legitimate and non-binding sources in accordance with the provisions of legislation.

CHAPTER XII TRANSITIONAL PROVISION

Article 28

At the time this Regional Regulation comes into force, all legal products in the Region regarding Acceleration of Stunting Reduction are declared to remain effective to the extent not contrary to this Regional Regulation.

CHAPTER XIII FINAL PROVISIONS

Article 29

The implementing regulations of this Regional Regulation are issued not later than 1 (one) year after this Regional Regulation is promulgated.

Article 30

This Regional Regulation comes into force on the date of its promulgation.

In order that every person may know hereof, it is ordered to promulgate this Regional Regulation by its placement in the the Regency of East Belitung Regional Gazette.

ELUCIDATION OF
REGULATION OF THE REGENCY OF EAST BELITUNG
NUMBER 15 OF 2023
ON
ACCELERATION OF STUNTING REDUCTION

I. GENERAL

Decentralization marked by the enactment of Law Number 23 of 2014 on Local Governments. This law contains provisions stating that the health sector is entirely entrusted to the respective regions, which are given the authority to manage and organize all aspects of health. Over the past five years, the government has increased its attention and budget to accelerate the stunting reduction by issuing the presidential regulation and designating 160 priority regencies and cities for stunting mitigation. The issue is that, although the prevalence of stunted infants in Indonesia in 2018 was still high at 30.8%, or about 1 in 3 children under 5 (five) years of age being stunted, there is no prevalence data at the sub-district and village levels that can help identify priority intervention areas.

Currently, information regarding the prevalence of nutritional status among children under 5 (five) years of age is only available at the national, provincial, and district levels, derived from the Basic Health Research survey. However, in five years, the government aims to reduce the stunting rate to 19%. The lack of information poses a challenge for the government in targeting anti-stunting programs to smaller areas. Accurate information related to priority regions and the prevalence rate of nutritional status is crucial to assist policymakers in allocating budgets and other resources to the appropriate targets. Considering the importance of Accelerating Stunting Reduction in the Regency of East Belitung, there is a significant need for regulations concerning the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction as a legal basis for the local government to implement policies and programs aimed at achieving a Stunting-free Regency.

The target groups for the Acceleration of Stunting Reduction include: a. adolescents; b. brides and grooms; c. pregnant women; d. breastfeeding mothers; and e. children aged 0 (zero) to 59 (fifty-nine) months. Furthermore, the implementation of the Stunting Reduction Acceleration must be supported by organizational strength and coordination, as well as strategies. For the solidification of task execution, integrated programs and activities, it is necessary to establish a Stunting Reduction Acceleration Team in the Regency of East Belitung.

In general, this Regional Regulation contains essential material systematically organized to include general provisions, Targets of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, Pillars of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, Implementation of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction,

Coordination of Acceleration of Stunting Reduction, Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting, Strategies for Accelerating the Reduction of Stunting, Research and Development, Establishment of Target Areas for Stunting Reduction, Cooperation, Roles of rural/urban Village Governments, Awards, Funding, Transitional Provisions, and Final Provisions.
